

WATCH WHAT YOUR CHILD'S WATCHING.



- **Do Your research.** Find safe and child-friendly search engines for your child to use. Bookmark them for easy access.
- **Make an agreement.** Create an agreement with your child that outlines which site he or she is allowed to visit, and which are off-limits. If your child accidentally goes to an unsuitable website he or she should tell you, so you can delete it from the 'history' folder.
- **Stay aware.** Keep lines of communication open so you know what websites your child is visiting. Pay attention to his or her surfing habits.
- **Acceptable internet use.** The computer must be in a family room with the screen facing outward so you see what's going on.
- **Watch out for online bullying.** Your child should understand that they should never be afraid to tell you about frightening or bullying emails or messages they get with unacceptable content. It's not their fault they have received them and addresses can be added to the parental control filter list.
- **Safe downloads.** Your child shouldn't download unknown files from the internet without you agreeing. It's best to never download unknown files at all.
